AND PHRASES

Tamazight or Berber is still the language of the indigenous people of Morocco...The official languages are

Arabic and Tamazight, but Morocco has a distinctive Arabic dialect called Darija that is widely spoken throughout the country.

While most of the words find their root in Standard Arabic, some words are borrowed fromTamazight, Spanish Portuguese, and French.

Azul: Hello in Tamazight/ Berber

Salam Alaikom/Salam: Hello/ 'peace be upon you'.

Wa alaikum Salam: Response to Salam Alaikom

Shokran- Merci [French]: Thank you

Tanmirt: Thank you in Tamazight

Bla Jmil: You are welcome

Fumya: You are welcome in Tamazight

Bismellah: In the name of Allah (said before beginning anything)

Al-hamdu-lillah: I'm fine (literally, Praise be to god, used after finishing anything)

Smeh liya: Pardon [French]: Sorry

La Ysahel: might god make it easy on you (commonly said to beggars to keep them away

Afak: Please

Bslama: Good bye

Sabbah Ikhir: good morning

Msa Ikhir: good night

Wakha: OK

La: No

lyeh: Yes

Labas?: How are you?

Labas: I'm fine (yes, the response is the same as the question)

Feen...? : Where is...?

Shahal taman/C'est combien?: (French) How much (price?)

Inshallah: God Willing

Biss'ha: Literally, to your health. Enjoy (your meal). Said to people after eating, drinking, showering, or anything that would improve their physical, mental, or emotional health.

Lay tekss'ha: May God give you (health)

Biss'ha: In response

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
